<p>Geography:</p> <p>Gather facts about recent natural disasters around the world - where do they occur? What natural disasters does England suffer from? Present them in an interesting way:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Poster - Fact file 	<p>Geography:</p> <p>Locate famous volcanoes on a world map. Where are they? What can you find out about those countries? What do the flags look like for those countries?</p>	<p>Science:</p> <p>Make your own tornado in a bottle!</p> <p>Fill $\frac{1}{4}$ with water; add a few drops of washing up liquid and some glitter. Turn upside down and spin it really fast. Can you see a mini tornado forming?</p>	<p>Problem solving:</p> <p>Imagine that your home was destroyed in a natural disaster and you have to make a shelter to live in. Build your own den and take a photo for evidence.</p>

<p>Maths Y5:</p> <p>Get a parent / guardian to make up some questions on these topics.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Count in steps of powers of 10 for any given number up to 1,000,000. - Read Roman numbers to 1000 (M). - Read, write, order and compare numbers to at least 1,000,000. - Read, write, order and compare numbers with up to 3 decimal places. 	<p>Maths Y6:</p> <p>Get a parent / guardian to make up some questions on these topics.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Identify the value of each digit to three decimal places. - Read, write, order and compare numbers up to 10,000,000. - Use negative numbers in context, calculating across zero. 	<p>SPAG:</p> <p>We are focussing on:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Word classes (adjectives, nouns, adverbs and verbs) - Commas (lists and clause) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Apostrophes - Direct speech (inverted commas) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Modal verbs <p>Use:</p> <p>https://www.theschoolrun.com/primary-grammar-glossary-parents to support your child's learning.</p> <p>Practise writing sentences using these different grammatical features</p>
