Weekly Update and Information

Hi All

I hope you are well and you have had a positive week.

We had an assembly for 'Safer Internet Day' on Wednesday, focussing on scams and how they can affect our technology use. Nationally, Safer Internet Day is next Tuesday. The children listened and participated well, and they got all of the quiz questions right at the end, knowing that they should seek adult help and support when something 'pops' up or appears on their technology that shouldn't, including not giving out their personal information.

Nationally, this week, it is 'Children's Mental Health Week'. We will be having an assembly next week, and the theme is 'Know Yourself, Grow Yourself' in partnership with Here4You, supported by The Walt Disney Company and the *Inside Out 2* characters.

Next half term it will be World Book Day on Thursday 6th March. Children can come to school dressed as a book character or something to do with reading, if they / you want to. This is not an expectation and please do not feel pressured to be buying a costume. We will be doing lots to celebrate reading and books that week and on the Thursday. Dressing up is just an additional idea for the children to enjoy.

If there are issues in the community re parking, it is Civil Enforcement Officers (CEOs) who deal with this. The enforcement of parking offences such as school zig zags / double yellows etc, are enforced by the CEOs alongside the following list: limited waiting bays; double and single yellow lines; on street pay and display bays; residents' parking zones; Blue Badge bays; loading bays; bus stops; taxi bays; school keep clears; clearways; dropped kerb access (also police); double parking (also police); pedestrian crossings (also police); car parks (with orders).

To report issues that the Civil Enforcement Officers enforce such as double yellows or school zig zags, please report direct via email: contact.centre@derbyshire.gov.uk or by calling: 01629 533190.

The police are responsible for enforcing: double white lines; obstruction – for example, pavements with no parking restrictions; dangerous parking where there are no restrictions in place, for example, on bends, brows of hills and junctions; dropped kerb access (also CEOs); double parking (also CEOs); one-way traffic; box junctions; access only white-hatched areas; pedestrian crossings (also CEOs)
