Derbyshire Police and Crime Commissioner, Nicolle Ndiweni-Roberts, would like to hear views on crime and community safety in Derbyshire. Throughout the year the Commissioner runs a survey called Listening To You, asking for Derbyshire residents' views on crime and community safety. This is done to ensure that the priorities the Commissioner sets for policing, community safety and victim services reflect the issues that matter most to Derbyshire residents, wherever they live in the City or the County. Using the responses from the survey, the Commissioner will work with the Chief Constable to ensure that resources are balanced efficiently with residents' concerns. The survey questions cover feelings of safety, experiences of crime and anti-social behaviour in the area where you live, and opinions on local policing. It is designed to help students 'know their rights' and understand the consequences of their illegal use. Derbyshire Constabulary operates a zero-tolerance approach to e-scooter use across the county and city.
