Citizens Advice Mid Mercia have the South Derbyshire Neurodevelopmental Community Hubs. They are a free service commissioned by the NHS / Joined Up Care Derbyshire to provide information and guidance (IAG) to children, young people and families in the South Derbyshire area that may be neurodivergent. No diagnosis is needed to access the service, as the service is designed to support families that are currently awaiting assessment to ensure they can access holistic support and information whilst they wait. The ND Hubs run weekly, alternating between the south office in Church Gresley and Swadlincote Library, all hubs are run between 10.00am and 4.00pm. The next ND hub is at Swadlincote Library (Swadlincote Library, Civic Way, Swadlincote, DE11 0AD) on Monday 17<sup>th</sup> of November. They also run parent / carer workshops every month with the opportunity to learn more about Autism and other neurodivergent diagnoses while also picking up strategies and tips on how to support a neurodiverse young person. The next workshop is on the 19<sup>th</sup> of November, 10.30am – 12.00pm, via Microsoft teams. Please see attached poster.
